

MyWay+ for ACT Seniors aged 60-69


MyWay+, Transport Canberra's new ticketing system, is **expected to launch in November 2024.** There is no need for you to take action until the MyWay+ online portal and mobile app become available, closer to the launch of the system.

Once MyWay+ is launched, you have the choice to continue to use a physical MyWay+ travel card or a new contactless or digital option. With MyWay+ you choose what works for you!

MyWay+ offers a range of simple payment options for bus and light rail, simply tap or scan your preferred method:

- Tap your debit or credit card
- **Tap** your debit or credit card stored in your smart phone or watch
- **Scan** the QR code on a MyWay+ pass (in the MyWay+ app)
- Scan the QR code on the printed ticket (from your MyWay+ account or ticket vending machine), or
- Tap your MyWay+ travel card

You will still be able to access your free or discounted travel no matter how you choose to travel! **To ensure you receive the right fare, always tap on and tap off with the same card or device.**



As an ACT Senior aged 60–69, you're entitled **to free off-peak travel** if you work fewer than 20 hours per week. To travel during **peak hours** (weekdays between 7:00 am – 9:00 am and 4:30 pm – 6:00 pm), you will need to pay a \$1.61 peak concession fare. **All concession holders must carry their proof of concession while traveling on public transport**.

Weekdays (off- peak)	9:00 am – 4:30 pm and after 6:00 pm	FREE
Weekdays (peak)	7:00 am – 9:00 am and 4:30 pm – 6:00 pm	\$1.61 (peak concession fare)
Weekends and public holidays	All day	FREE

Transitioning from MyWay to MyWay+

Until June 2025 ACT Senior card holders (60–69) can use their Seniors card as a flash card while **travelling off peak**. After this time, customers will be required to either create a MyWay+ account or use a MyWay+ travel card. If **travelling in peak**, customers have the above options to pay for travel on bus and light rail services. The Seniors card can still be used post June 2025 for concession validation.
